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Black and British, a study over 2,000 years



Here you will learn by investigating the first recordings of a black person in Britain over 2,000 years ago. Using historical clues, consider what roles Black people played in British society 500 years ago, study the slave trade, making links to local man, Josiah Wedgwood. Explain the impact the arrival of the SS Windrush had on Britain, making comparisons with then and now.

Here you will consider the cause and effects of Britain going to war. You will evaluate evidence to show how propaganda was used to control the information given out during this time and the impact this had. Using primary evidence, you will state reasons why children needed to be evacuated during this time and consider the impact this had.

The Battle of Britain

You will learn about this ancient civilisation from South America, the legacies they left us and the ingenious ways they adapted to thrive in their harsh terrain. You will compare and contrast how they were much more advanced than other civilisations, of the same time period, and evaluate the factors that eventually lead to their downfall.

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Victorian Era



Learn about the huge changes that happened during the Victorian period, especially due to the invention of the steam engine, leading to the Industrial revolution. Consider how lives for children were very different, from today, as they were forced out to work. How did the lives of the rich and poor compare? Conclude your learning by deciding if the Victorian era was a Golden or dark age based on your knowledge.

Building on your learning of ancient civilisations, your journey continues with the ancient Egyptians, comparing these with other ancient civilisations. Here you will consider who they were, find out how to embalm and why this was so important to them. Using historical sources, discover what was the gift to the people from the river Nile and explore how did they live their daily lives?

Learning about ancient Greeks, you will study primary sources to discover Greek life, investigate the mighty Athens and how it stayed so strong. Through historical enquiry, you will discover Greek democracy and compare with democracy as we know it in modern times, considering the influence still on our lives today.
